

# Programme Requirements for Bachelor of Social Sciences with Honours in Applied Social Studies (with specialisation in Criminology)

Students admitted to the Bachelor of Social Sciences with Honours programme are required to declare the stream they wish to pursue at the time prescribed by the University. The available streams are:

- i. Ageing Society and Services Studies
- ii. Applied Economics
- iii. Applied Social Studies
- iv. Global and China Studies
- v. Politics and Public Administration

Students of the Applied Social Studies stream are required to choose a specialisation at the time prescribed by the Department of Social Sciences. The available specialisations are:

- a. Applied Social Studies (with no specialisation)
- b. Applied Social Studies (with specialisation in Criminology)
- c. Applied Social Studies (with specialisation in Cultural and Heritage Studies)
- d. Applied Social Studies (with specialisation in Social Policy and Youth Studies)

These programme requirements are applicable for students pursuing the specilsation of "Applied Social Studies (with specialisation in Criminology)" for the award of Bachelor of Social Sciences in Applied Social Studies. The specialisation in Criminology will be shown on transcript only.

#### 1. Programme Requirement - Year 1 Entry

- 1.1 To be eligible for the award of the Bachelor of Social Sciences with Honours in Applied Social Studies through Year 1 Entry with specialisation in Criminology, a student shall:
  - 1.1.1 obtain 120 credit-units as prescribed below, of which no more than 30 credit-units shall be at 1000-level, at least 24 credit-units shall be at 3000-level and at least 24 credit-units shall be at 4000-level:
    - 1.1.1.1 51 credit-units of core courses applicable to Year 1 entry as listed in Table 1;
    - 1.1.1.2 18 credit-units of specialisation courses in Table 2;
    - 1.1.1.3 12 credit-units\* of major elective courses applicable to Year 1 entry as listed in Table 3;
    - 1.1.1.4 15 credit-units\* of elective courses in specific area applicable to Year 1 entry from Table 4;
      - \*Among the 27 credit-units obtained from 1.1.1.3 and 1.1.1.4, students must complete at least 3 credit-units at 3000-level and at least 3 credit-units at 4000-level.
    - 1.1.1.5 9 credit-units of University Core courses in Table 5;
    - 1.1.1.6 6 credit-units of University English courses in Table 6;



1.1.1.7 9 credit-units of General Education (GE) courses (see www.hkmu.edu.hk/FT\_GE for the updated list of GE courses);

and

1.1.2 attain the CGPA for graduation as prescribed in the Regulations for the award of undergraduate degrees.

#### 2. Programme Requirement - Year 2 Entry

- 2.1 To be eligible for the award of Bachelor of Social Sciences with Honours in Applied Social Studies through Year 2 Entry with specialisation in Criminology, a student shall:
  - 2.1.1 obtain 93 credit-units as prescribed below, of which at least 24 credit-units shall be at 3000-level and at least 24 credit-units shall be at 4000-level:
    - 2.1.1.1 39 credit-units of core courses applicable to Year 2 entry as listed in Table 1;
    - 2.1.1.2 18 credit-units of specialisation courses in Table 2;
    - 2.1.1.3 9 credit-units\* of major elective courses applicable to Year 2 entry as listed in Table 3;
    - 2.1.1.4 15 credit-units\* of elective courses in specific area applicable to Year 2 entry as listed from Table 4;
      - \*Among the 24 credit-units obtained from 2.1.1.3 and 2.1.1.4, students must complete at least 3 credit-units at 3000-level and at least 3 credit-units at 4000-level.
    - 2.1.1.5 9 credit-units of University Core courses in Table 5;
    - 2.1.1.6 3 credit-units of General Education (GE) courses (see www.hkmu.edu.hk/FT\_GE for the updated list of GE courses);

and

2.1.2 attain the CGPA for graduation as prescribed in the Regulations for the award of undergraduate degrees.

#### 3. Programme Requirement – Year 3 Entry

- 3.1 To be eligible for the award of the Bachelor of Social Sciences with Honours in Applied Social Studies through Year 3 Entry with specialisation in Criminology, a student shall:
  - 3.1.1 obtain 66 credit-units as prescribed below, of which at least 24 credit-units shall be at 3000-level and at least 24 credit-units shall be at 4000-level:
    - 3.1.1.1 21 credit-units of core courses applicable to Year 3 entry as listed in Table 1;
    - 3.1.1.2 18 credit-units of specialisation courses in Table 2;



- 3.1.1.3 12 credit-units\* of major elective courses applicable to Year 3 entry as listed in Table 3;
- 3.1.1.4 6 credit-units\* of elective courses in specific area applicable to Year 3 entry as listed from Table 4;
  - \*Among the 18 credit-units obtained from 3.1.1.3 and 3.1.1.4, students must complete at least 3 credit-units at 3000-level and at least 3 credit-units at 4000-level.
- 3.1.1.5 9 credit-units of University Core courses in Table 5;

and

3.1.2 attain the CGPA for graduation as prescribed in the Regulations for the award of undergraduate degrees.
