
HKMU Best Buddies Programme - Building Friendships with Intellectual Disabilities 2024/2025 aims to encourage students to develop one-to-one friendships with people with

Service-Learning Trip to Africa 2024







A group of winning representatives who participated in the Service-Learning Challenge: Make a Difference in Community 2023/2024 departed for a 14-day Service-Learning Trip to Uganda in Africa in July 2024.

Apart from joining as participant, they also needed to plan the content of the service themselves, including voluntary teaching and designing courses for 270 local students in primary and secondary schools, visiting widows and her children in slums, assisting the local team of the "Keep a Girl in School" programme to conduct sharing with about 1,400 students, distributing 4,168 hygiene products to local female students, encouraging girls to study and leading the community to improve their lives. In addition, the participating students raised funds for primary school maintenance projects before the departure and then personally participated in the maintenance work at the school. This series of extraordinary trip will definitely become the unforgettable global learning experience for HKMU students.
