About the Speaker

Angel M. Y. Lin is Professor and Tier 1 Canada Research Chair in Plurilingual and Intercultural Education at Simon Fraser University, Canada. She has published widely on second language education, discourse analysis, trans/languageing (TL), trans-semiotizing (TS), Content and Language Integrated Learning (CLIL), and academic literacies.

Abstract

This seminar explores the transformative potential of the Multimodalities-Entextualization Cycle (MEC) (Lin, 2016) in the English-Medium Instruction (EMI) classroom. Recognizing the diverse funds of knowledge (Moll et al., 1992) that students bring to the learning environment, the MEC as a curriculum genre emphasizes the integration of multiple modes of communication, such as visual, auditory, and kinesthetic as well as students' diverse linguistic resources (L1, L2, L3), to enhance both content and language learning outcomes. By valuing students' existing knowledge and cultural and linguistic backgrounds, educators can effectively help students expand their communicative repertoires and foster a more inclusive and engaging classroom environment. This seminar will provide practical strategies and examples illustrating how to leverage the MEC to facilitate meaningful content and language learning while honoring the diversity of students' experiences, resources and voices.
